- 6. TRUST LANDS PROGRESS REPORT, 2013-14
  - Stacy Evans updated the Community Council on the current Trust Lands expenditures.
  - ❖ Ms. Evans proposed changes for 2013-14:
    - Language Arts Goals
      - ♦ Reduce Levels 1 and 2 on CRT by 1%
      - ♦ Narrow the achievement gap by 2% every year
    - Math Goals
      - ♦ Decrease Levels 1 and 2 on CRT by 4%
      - ♦ Narrow the achievement gap by 2% every year
    - Science Goals
      - Reduce the achievement gap by 2% every year at all levels, with an emphasis in 8th grade.
    - Continue the implementation of research based middle level best practices to improve student learning

Recommendations: keep ELL support, continue to support after school tutoring and activities, increase technology by adding new computers in one of the labs, continue to support subs for teachers to collaborate, continue support of professional development.

- ❖ William Boyea commented that it would be better to update an entire lab at once.
- ❖ Jenni Shelton inquired about ESL endorsed teachers in the school and asked about encouraging more teachers to become ESL endorsed.
- Stacy Evans presented information on the number of students participating in tutoring in December.
