

MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

I can't believe the first month of the 2016-17 school year is already behind us! We've had a great start to the school year, and you and your child may have noticed some new things happening here at West Hills.



Your child may have come
home the first week of school
talking about a new approach
we are using to increase ontask student behavior
throughout the school. This
new process is designed to
create a safe and productive
learning environment where
teachers can teach and all students can learn.

We have developed a unified

set of behavioral expectations and a schoolwide approach to intervening when a student is off-task or disrupts the learning environment. Each teacher has developed a system of rewards students and classes can earn for following the rules. You will see the behavior expectations posted throughout the school. Your child learned about them in each class during his or her first days at school.

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We are also involved in a schoolwide professional learning opportunity aimed at improving student success in learning. The Assessment to

Achievement (A2A) Professional Development program focuses on effectively using data to improve student achievement. School and district teams who participate in this two year program increase their own expertise in analyzing data and then use the analysis to inform instructional and program decisions that positively influence students and schools. This meets the majority of the improvement priorities we were given during our most recent accreditation site visit.

Assessment to Achievement weaves together all the current best practices in supporting educators and students, including the following:

- Two years of targeted professional development
- Professional learning communities
- Assessment literacy
- Data-based decision making
- Evidence-based instructional strategy implementation
- On-site coaching for teachers, administrators, and district leaders

As part of this process, we will be using data from the SAGE Classroom Interim assessments to inform our decisions related to instruction and school programs throughout the school year. We are excited to be the first middle school in Jordan School District to participate in Assessment to Achievement!



JORDAN BOND INFORMATION!

Fast Facts

- The amount of the proposed bond is \$245 million
- The proposed bond will be used for 6 new school buildings only
- The average homeowner will pay \$16.80 more per year than they currently pay for bond payments
- Within a few years, taxes for the bond will gradually
- More than 9,000 new students are projected to enroll in the District by the 2021-22 school year.

Although none of the bond money will be used for any new schools in our area, it is still important that our community support the bond because it will free up money that can be used for needed upgrades and repairs on our existing buildings.

Please contact Jordan District School Board members to tell them that although our community supports the bond because of the growth on the south end of our district, we respectfully ask that they remember the needs of the northwest quadrant of the district.
